## Guidelines for the User

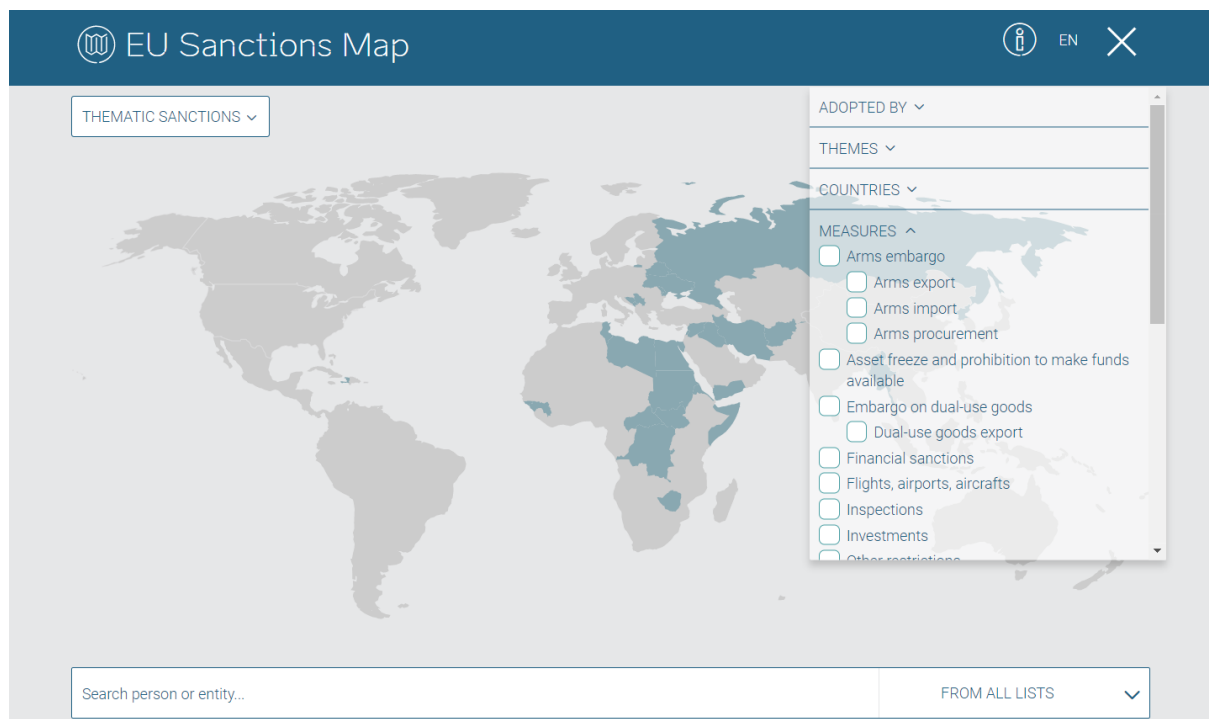
The EU Sanctions Map guarantees you the best user experience with the following browsers: Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, Safari, Edge. The EU Sanctions Map is created primarily for the use on a personal computer. It enables access via tablets and smartphones with limited operational functionalities. For more information on restrictive measures and the purpose of the EU Sanctions Map, click on the i symbol on the top right corner.

### How to use the EU Sanctions Map?

Several functions enable to obtain the information that is the most relevant for you.

First, there is the **filter menu on the top right** (see *Image 1*). This enables you to filter the information. You can combine the search results by ticking the check-boxes. The underlying world map and the table below the map react to your selections. Press **RESET** on the filter to restore the initial amount of information.

Second, you can **click on a country on the Map** (see *Image 2*) to obtain general information on the measures applied.

The legend for the icons is the following:

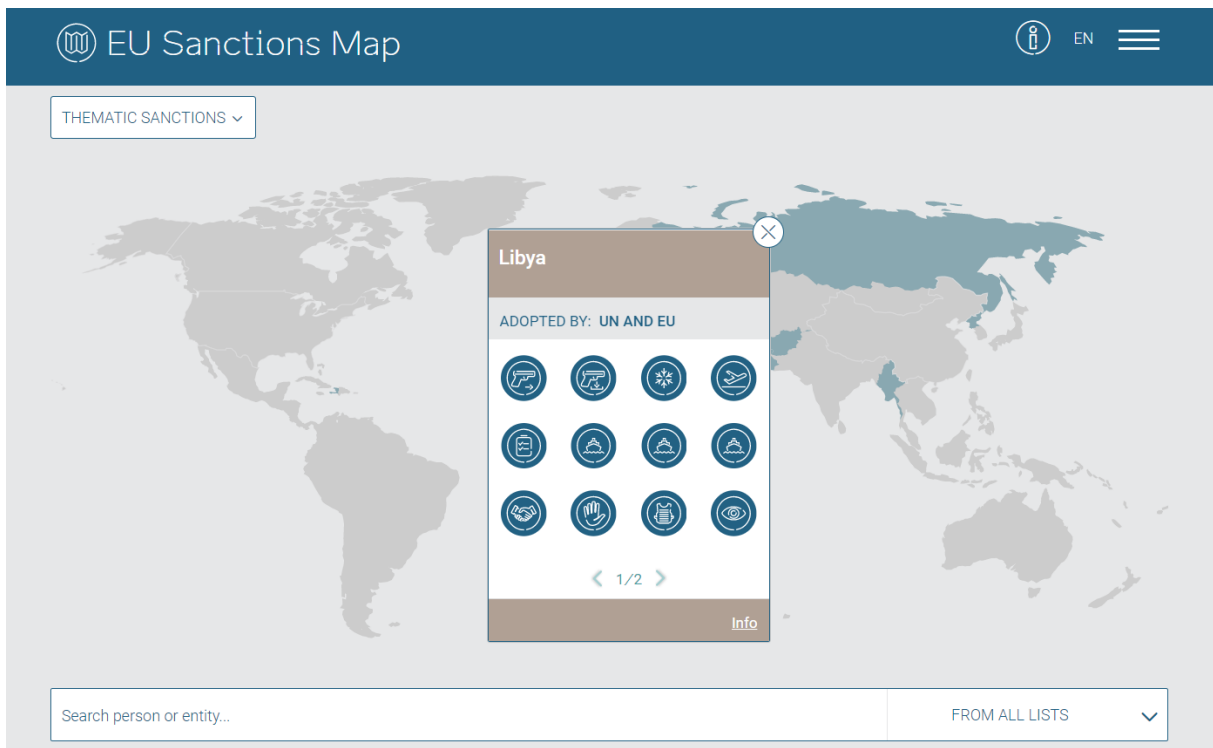

If you click on the Map and a pop-up opens, you will find out that the colors of the pop-up boxes are different depending on whether the sanction regime has been imposed by the UN, EU or if it is a mixed regime. Where several sanction regimes are related to one country (e.g. Libya) or theme (e.g. terrorism), the arrows under the symbols enable to navigate between the regimes. Click on the Info on the right corner below to open the view with more details.

Third, **there is a table below the Map** (see Image 3). You are being directed to the view with more details when you click on a sanction regime (e.g. Afghanistan). If you click on the staple

symbol under the List, Legal acts or Guidance column, the respective information opens in the view with more details. If you click on the symbols of the measures in the table, you will see the description of the measure.

Fourth, there is the **search** (*see Image 5*). The search enables you to look up those persons and entities that are included in the Annexes of the restrictive measures regimes. Type at least three characters and press Enter on your keyboard. Both the Map and the table below indicate the search results. Press X on the right of the search bar to restore the initial view. If you specify the search from the right side and select FROM FSD, it only provides results on those persons and entities that are subject to asset freeze and included in the Financial Sanctions Database (FSD) administered by the European Commission.

Fifth, there is the view with more details (*see Image 6*). You can get to this view by clicking on the regime on the table that is below the Map or by clicking on the Info in the right corner of the pop-up that opens when you click on a country on the Map. This view with more details enables you to filter the information (List of persons, entities and items, Legal acts, Guidelines), but it also includes some standing information. The table for legal acts and guidelines are at the bottom of the view with more details of the relevant sanction regime.

To close this view, press X on the right corner. If you click *Back* on your browser, it takes you to the previous webpage you visited. If the sanction regime includes lists of persons and entities from the FSD, the entries are clickable and enable you to access more information on the person or entity. If a measure is linked to a list of items, it is accessible by clicking on the staple symbol under the specific measure (e.g. on Image 6 the EU Common Military List linked to the Arms export measure is accessible by clicking on the staple symbol).
